

Call for Applications for ERASMUS+ Students Mobility

Background

The University of Energy and Natural Resources ([UENR](#)), Sunyani is a partner on the Erasmus+ KA171 programme, hosted by the University of Jaén (UJA) in Spain. The Erasmus+ KA171 Programme supports mobility (for both students and staff between UJA and UENR (and other universities)).

[UJA](#) is a young (founded in 1993) and dynamic institution located in the province of Jaén, Andalusia in Spain. UJA is structured in two modern campuses (Las Lagunillas Campus, in Jaén, and Linares Scientific and Technological Campus, in Linares) equipped with advanced facilities and resources at the service of students and teaching staff. The UJA university community is made up of nearly 18,000 people, being one of the most internationalised Spanish universities, welcoming around 2,500 international students each year (both mobility and degree-seeking students). UJA offers programmes partly or fully taught in English, as well as a wide range of other subjects in English language. For years, UJA has occupied a prestigious position in the top 5 Spanish universities with the highest funding in the Erasmus+ international Credit Mobility programme.

The Call

Applications are invited from suitably qualified students of the University of Energy and Natural Resources (UENR) to apply for consideration to participate in the Erasmus KA 171 mobility for the 2026/27 First Semester (**September 2026 until January 2027**) the University of Jaen in Spain. This call is open to **ONLY** undergraduate and postgraduate students studying at UENR.

Interested applicants should review the requirements below, and if interested, may apply by submitting all the following documents.

Requirements

The following documents constitute the application pack, and **must** be provided.

1. Undergraduate Students:

- a. Must be in Level 200 or Level 300
- b. Application Letter
- c. A copy of updated transcript
- d. Updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- e. Letter of support from the Head of Department
- f. A copy of passport bio-page

2. Master's Students:

- a. Bachelor's degree certificate with First or Second Class (Upper Division)

- b. Must have completed all taught courses, preferably in the second year
- c. Application Letter
- d. Statement of intent/motivation
- e. A copy of updated transcript
- f. Research synopsis, including a research plan
- g. Updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- h. Letter from your Head of Department or School of Graduate Studies supporting your application.
- i. A copy of passport bio-page

3. **PhD Students:**

- a. Bachelor's degree certificate with First or Second Class (Upper Division)
- b. Master's degree in a field related to the PhD research
- c. Must have completed all taught courses, preferably in the second or third year
- d. Statement of intent/motivation
- e. Approved research proposal
- f. Progress report on PhD studies, using the School of Graduate Studies template and signed by research supervisor
- g. Updated Curriculum Vitae (CV)
- h. Letter of support from the Head of Department or School of Graduate Studies
- i. A copy of passport bio-page

In addition to the above, all applicants will attend a selection interview and must have a valid passport at the time of application. There are **only 2 slots** available for this call.

Funding: Successful applicants will be provided with a modest amount as travel support and a monthly stipend to cover living expenses in Spain.
